Other SAR societies regularly use a color guard to help reflect the pageantry and rich heritage of the American Revolutionary times, including appearances at events like the opening of football games, veterans' memorial services, JROTC school events, 4th of July parades, and to open their own annual meetings and conventions, to name a few. Over the past year, Hawaii SAR Compatriots have been forming a Hawaii Society Color Guard, collecting commitments for future participation in such appropriate events. To this extent I have appointed Elbridge W. Smith as Color Guard Commander and Chris Tourtellot as Adjutant, with members Alan McCullough, Bill Settle, Elbridge Z. Smith, and myself joining the corps.



Hawaii Society members have chosen the uniform coloring as seen above in a photo of the Georgia Society color guard – the Buff and Blue (no, no, not for that school) is the color scheme that General George Washington had selected for the Continental troops at the latter part of the Revolutionary War.

Other interested HISSAR members should volunteer now, as our initial uniform order is about to be placed.

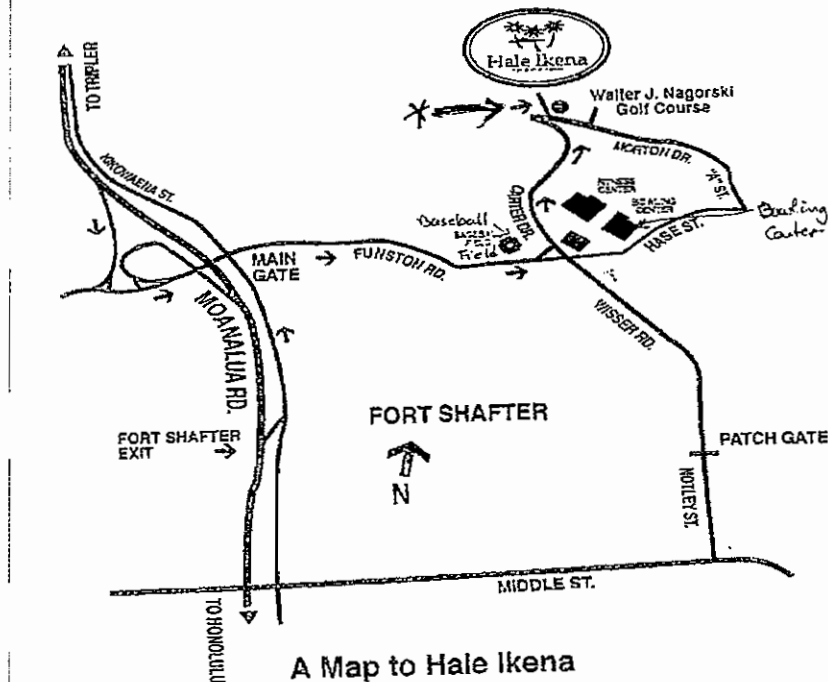

FROM EWA: Take FT. SHAFTER EXIT and turn left at traffic light. Follow road through MAIN GATE on FUNSTON ROAD. Turn left onto CARTER DRIVE from left turn only lane. Follow road and take sharp right up MORTON DRIVE. Hale Ikena entrance is on left before the circular moss rock building (Round House).

FROM HONOLULU: Take FT. SHAFTER EXIT onto KIKOWAENA ROAD. Turn right through MAIN GATE onto FUNSTON ROAD. Turn left onto CARTER DRIVE from left turn only lane. Follow road and take sharp right up MORTON DRIVE. Hale Ikena entrance is on left before the circular moss rock building (Round House).

IMPORTANT: To make things go as smoothly as possible, we need the following information from you so that we can give advance notice to the Fort Shafter Police:

1. Year, make and color of vehicle you will be using
2. License Plate number
3. Names of people who will be coming with you
4. Be sure to bring the following documents with you to Fort Shafter:
 - 1] Driver's license
 - 2] CURRENT no fault insurance
 - 3] Vehicle registration
 - 4] Current Safety Check
